Bizarre News Story of the Week

Four-letter word has teacher in sin-bin Sydney Morning Herald: September 5, 2007

IT IS a simple question: who leads this country? Any John, Dick or Kevin could answer it, but one citizenship teacher may be wishing she had refrained.

One student, Erez Sharabani, shot up his hand to answer "Mr John Howard". But before he could get the words out, he says, the teacher wrote "dick" across the middle of the board. She rubbed it out, but not before the 12 students in her citizenship class at the NSW Adult Migrant English Service at Surry Hills saw it.

Calling the Prime Minister a four-letter word in a class funded by the federal Department of Immigration and Citizenship has not proved a great career move, sparking a complaint from Mr Sharabani and an investigation by the NSW Department of Education. The teacher, who has not been named, has been suspended on pay pending the outcome of the investigation.

The leadership question was one of 10 the teacher wrote on the board to help students prepare for the new compulsory citizenship test. Mr Sharabani became a citizen in 2005 but attends the class as part of a broader English-language skills program. He is passionate about his new country, describing it as "a very exciting time to get citizenship of an amazing country". Mr Sharabani, 40, of Bondi Beach, who came to Australia from Israel in 2000, walked out before the class ended, and says he was deeply disturbed by the disrespect. That night he fired off emails to the Prime Minister; the Immigration Minister, Kevin Andrews; the NSW Board of Studies and the head of the English Service. Referring to the "dick" incident, he wrote: "This is not acceptable. This lesson is meant to encourage newly arrived Australians to be able to connect with their new country." He said Mr Andrews's spokeswoman rang him yesterday and said the minister took the situation very seriously.

Mark Davis, a spokesman for the Education Department, said the department's policy was to keep politics out of the classroom. The manager of AMES Surry Hills, Tith Tiru, said she had sought comment from the other students but could not comment while the review was under way.
